



## FISHING AT MIAVANA

*Discover an angler's dream in and around the archipelago*

### FROM THE BOAT

The boat fishing season at Miavana runs from October to April, offering a range of exciting fishing experiences, including trolling, popping, jigging, bottom fishing, and deep-sea excursions. Top of the line equipment is available at Miavana but if you would like to bring your own, please do not hesitate. Our passionate and experienced team will be delighted to help you land your most exciting catches. The popping and jigging opportunities in the area are exceptional, with fish such as Jobfish, Groupers, King Mackerel, Yellowfin Tuna, and Giant Trevally (GT) ranging between 20 and 50 kg. There are excellent reefs and drop-offs for fly fishing with sinking lines where you might catch big Dogtooth Tuna, GTs, and Sailfish.

### FROM LAND

Fly fishing on the flats and drop-offs offers the chance to catch GTs, Bluefin Kingfish, Parrotfish, and other reef species that come into the shallower waters of the island during a pushing tide, especially on neap tides. These conditions provide more time to wade in search of cruising fish. Whether you're seeking heart-stopping action or leisurely targeting smaller fish, the area is an angler's dream, with over 40 species available to catch and release.

### Quick Facts:

### Equipment:

- + Popping: A selection of big quality poppers and stickbaits (floating & sinking) for all top water fishing.
- + Jigging: Jigs ranging from 150 - 300 grams for shallow-water and deep-water jigging.
- + Light / Medium spinning: Small spoons, dropshot, small poppers / stick baits and plugs for lighter fishing applications.
- + Flies: Baitfish patterns like sempers, brush flies, poppers and clousers all work well for the Trevally family, Barracuda etc. Crustacean patterns such as flexo crabs and charlies can be used to target reef species and Parrotfish.
